The Application File, introducing Tokyo's plan to host the Olympic and Paralympic Games, is the Bid Committee's "Response to the Questionnaire" for Applicant Cities that was sent out by the IOC and contained 25 questions.

Based on the responses from each Applicant City, the IOC will select the cities that will become Candidate Cities at the IOC Executive Board meeting held in Athens in June 2008.

Long-term Benefits of the Bid:

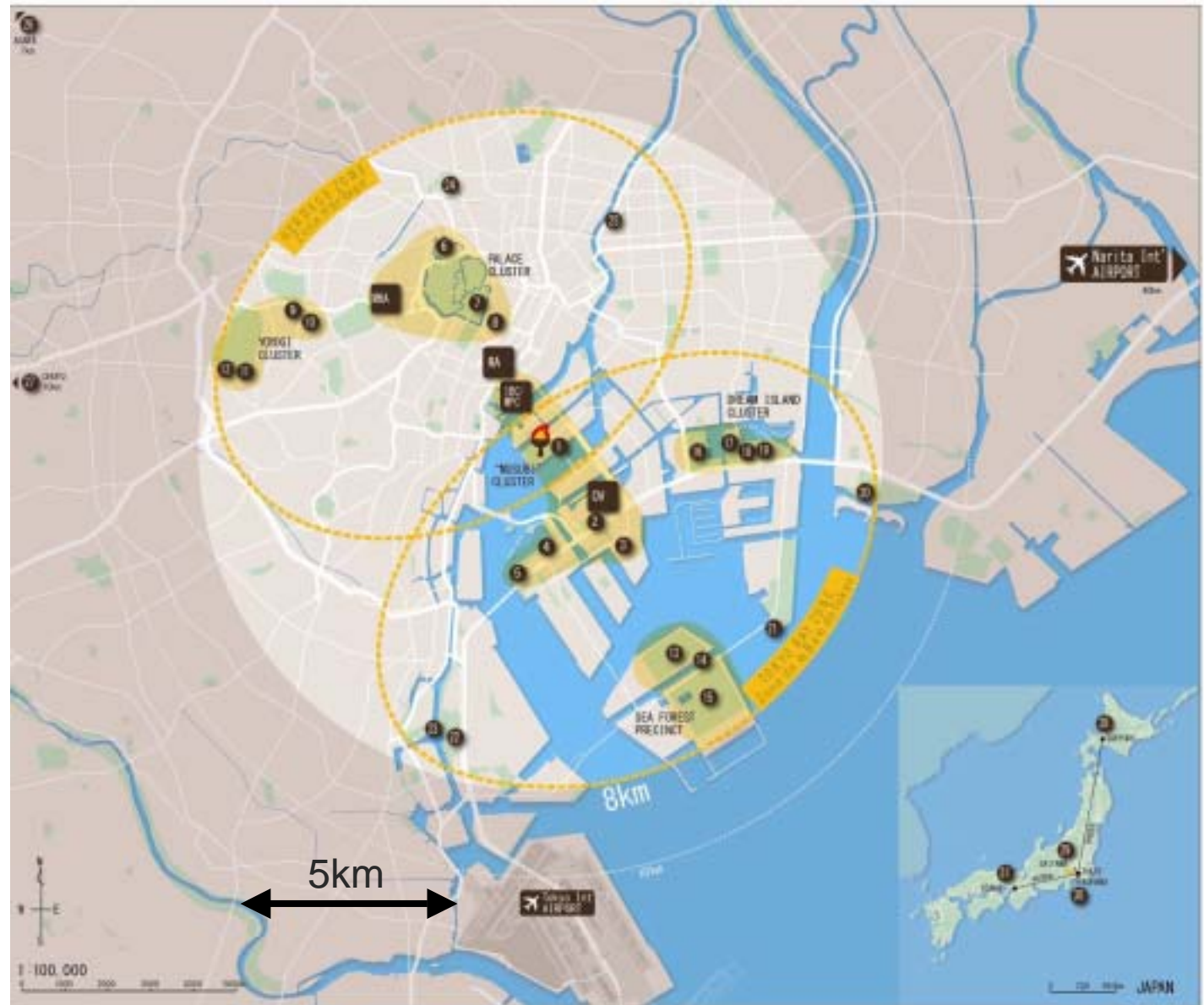
- The creation of a model 'sports culture' for the older citizens as well as the young

CONCEPT

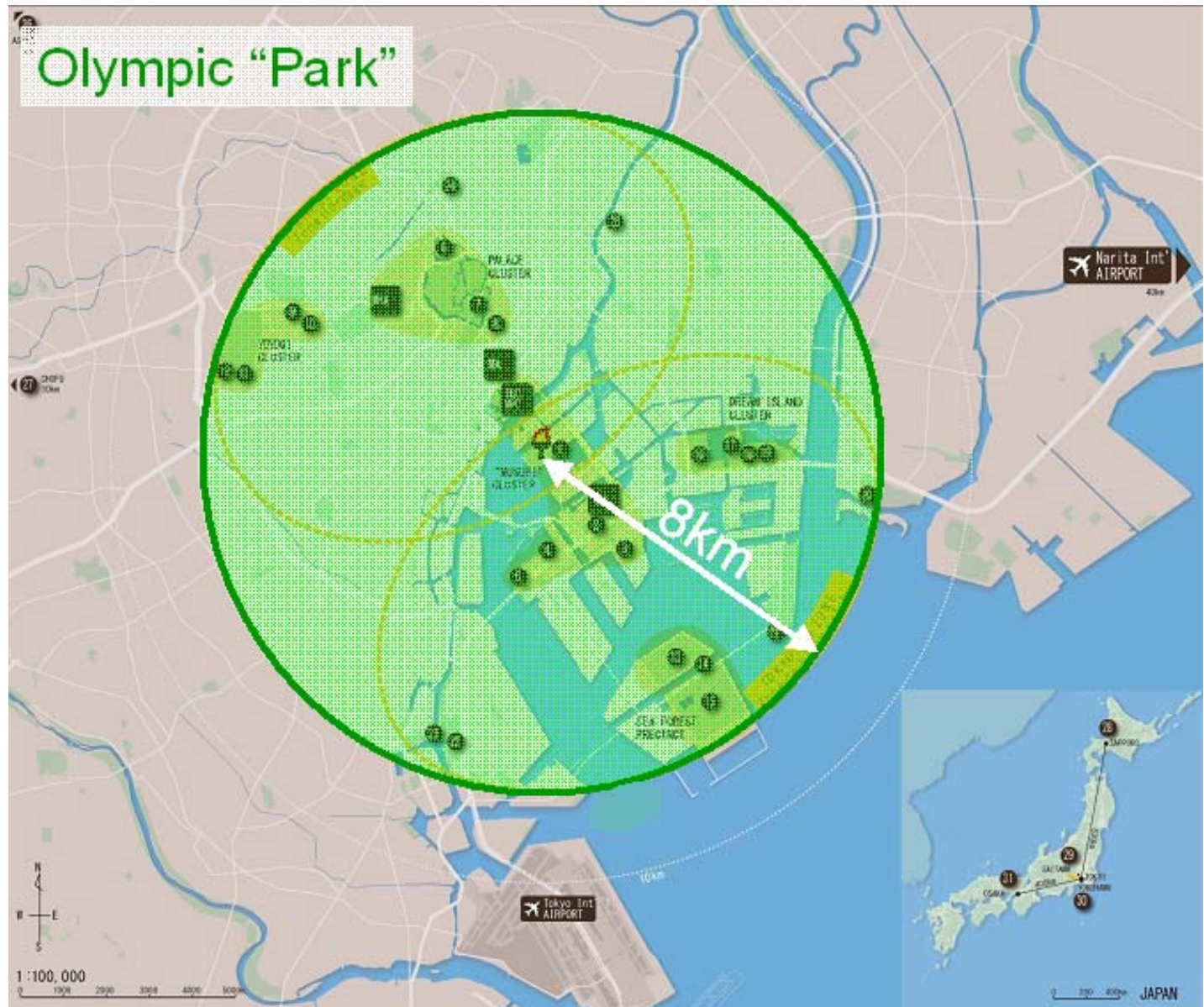
Tokyo's concept for the Olympic Games:

Central Tokyo will function as an Olympic “Park” during the Games. Careful planning will ensure that the Olympic experience will permeate the city.

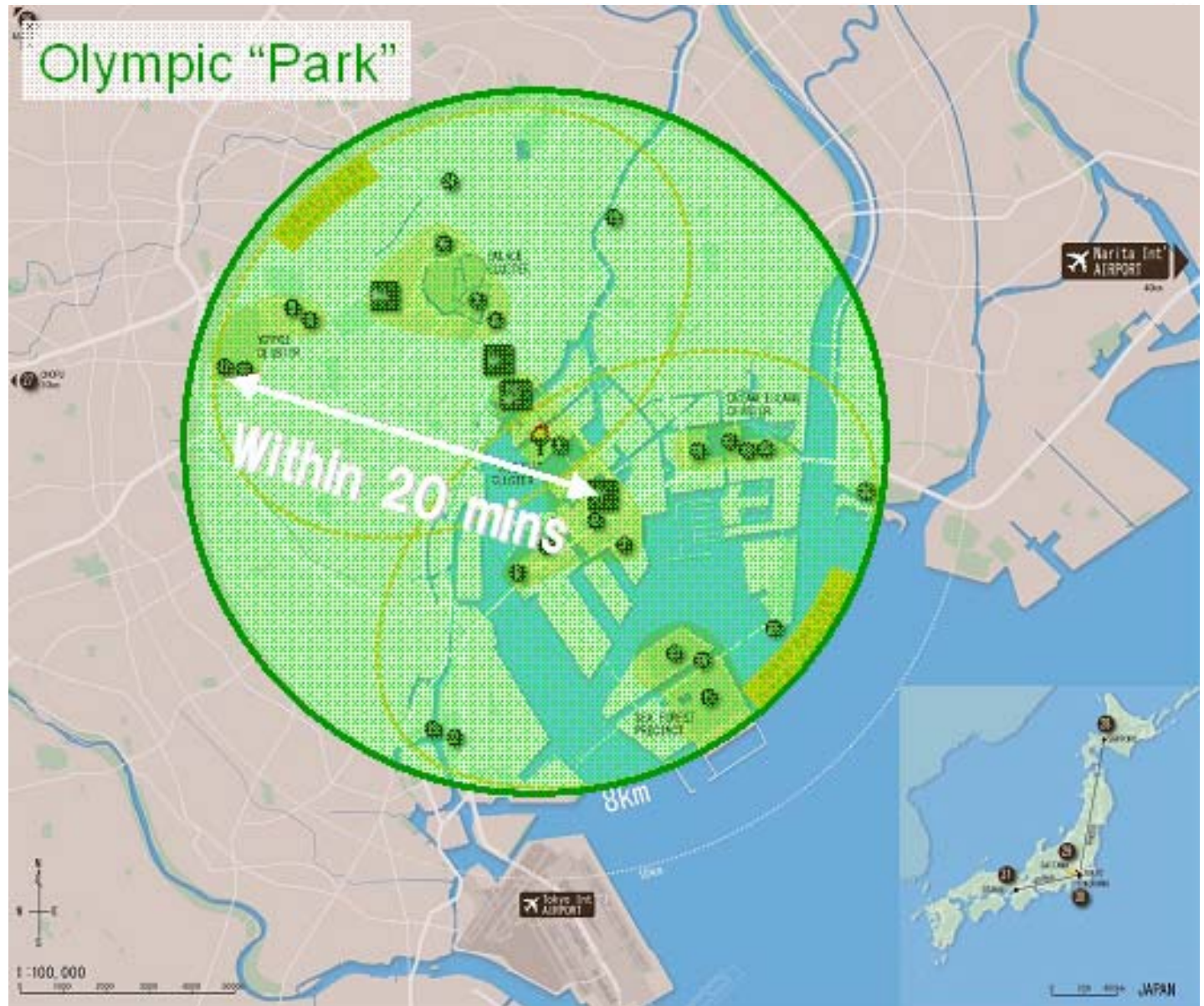
CENTRAL TOKYO – THE OLYMPIC “PARK”



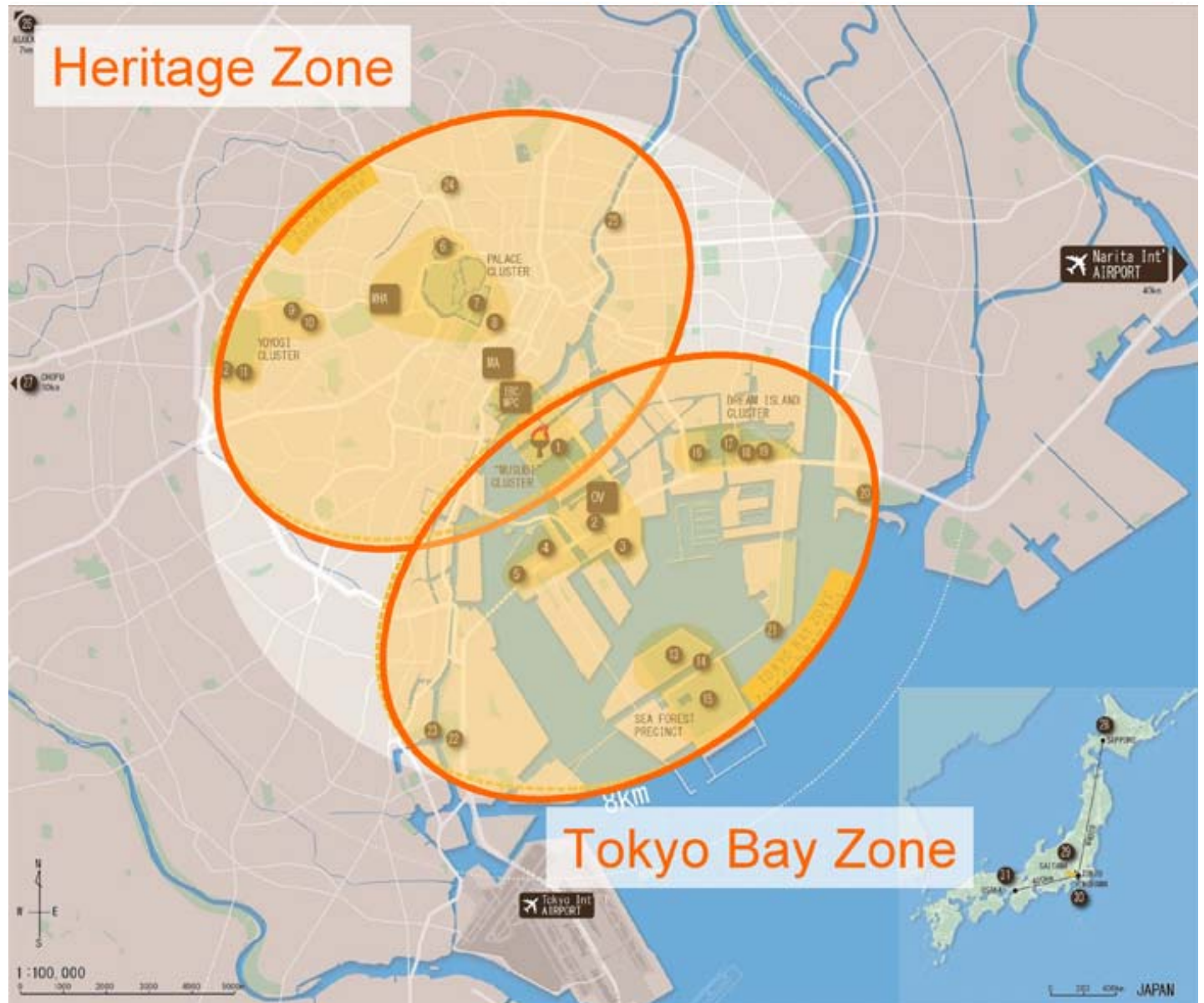

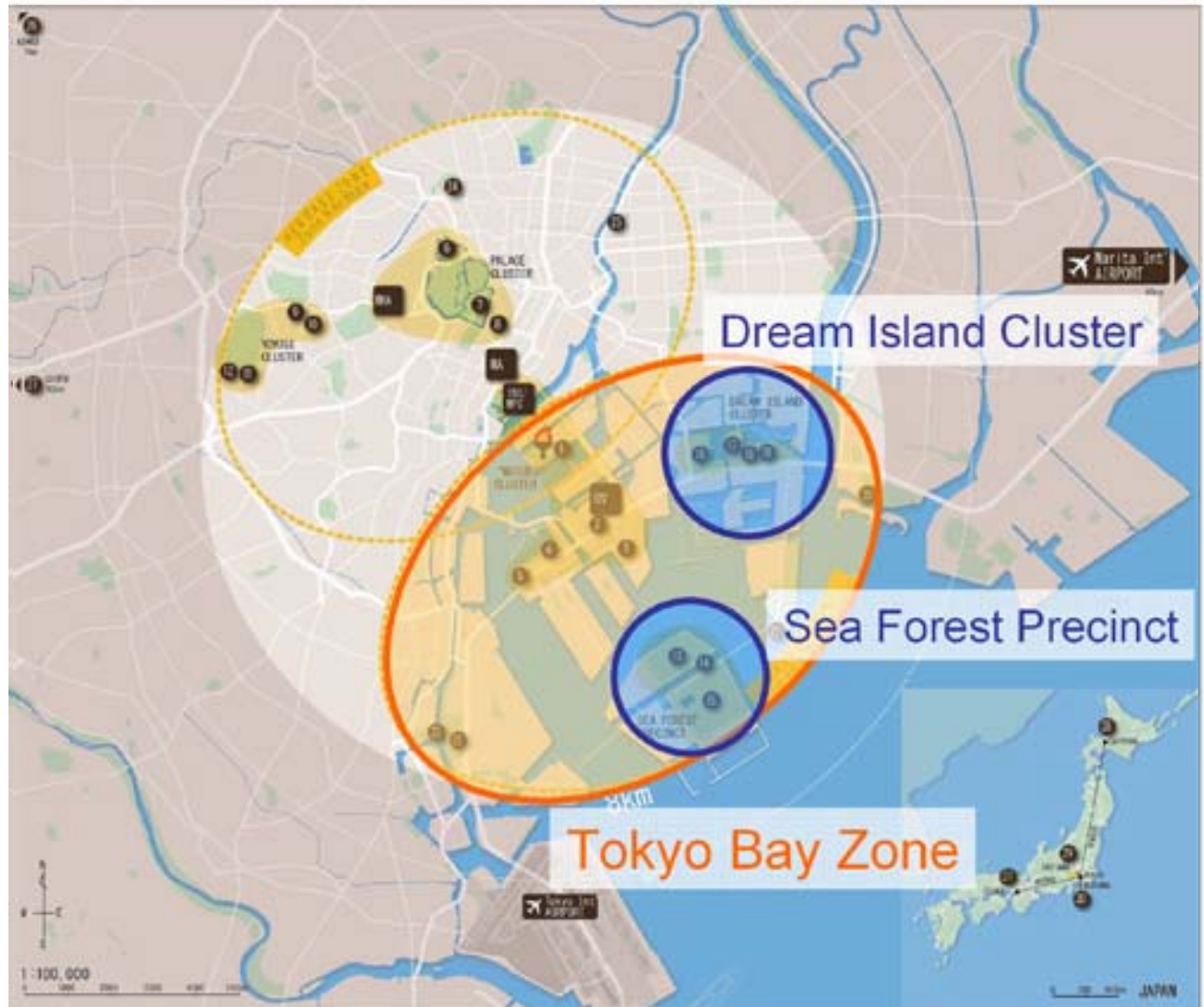

TOKYO BAY ZONE

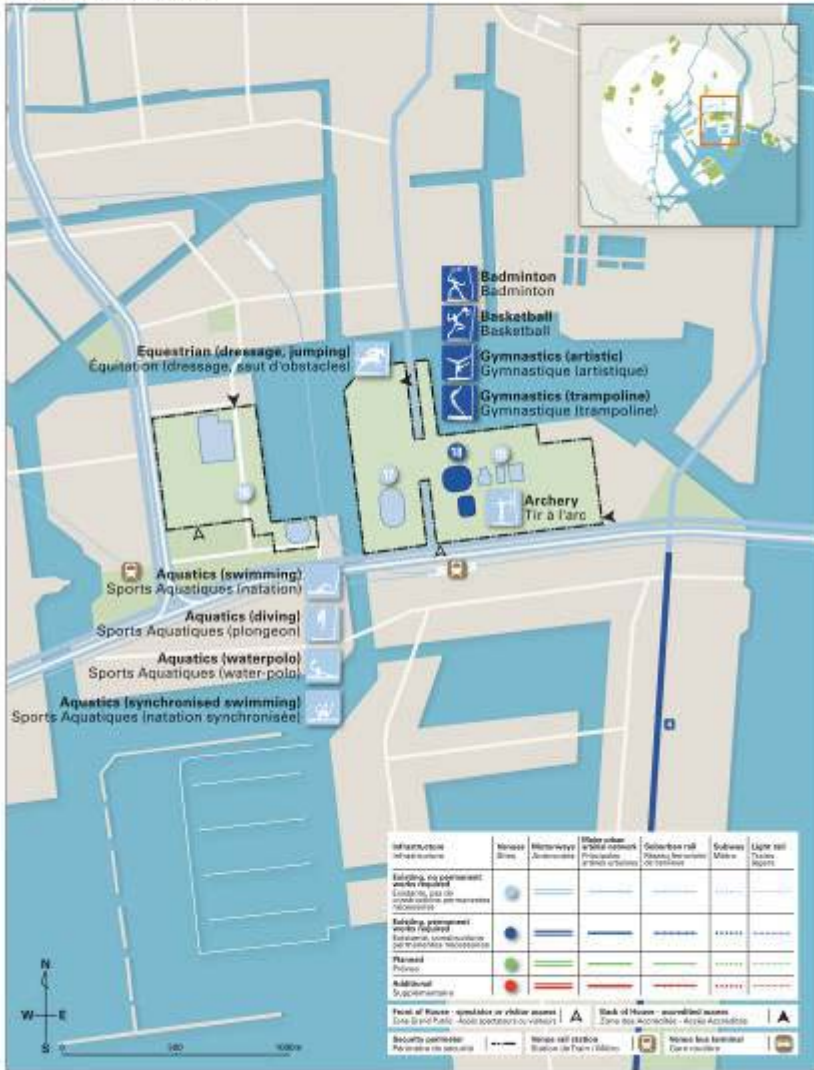


Tokyo Bay Zone



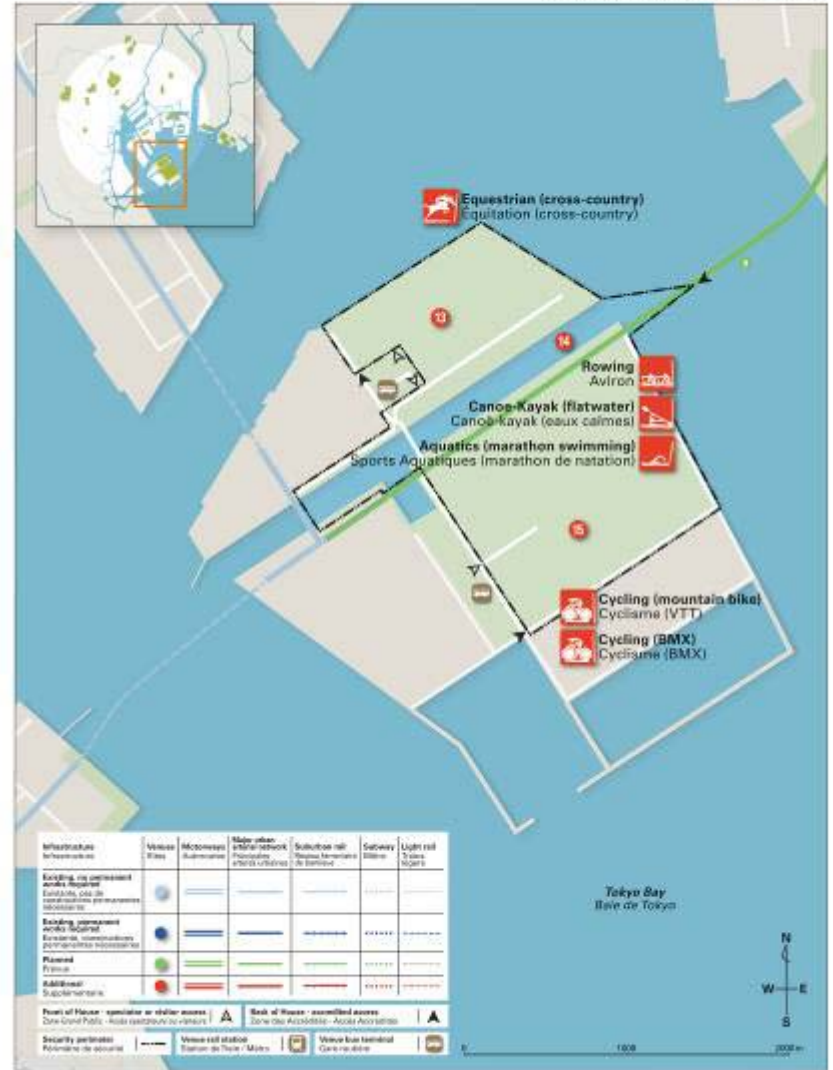

Plan B5 Noyau Île de Rêve

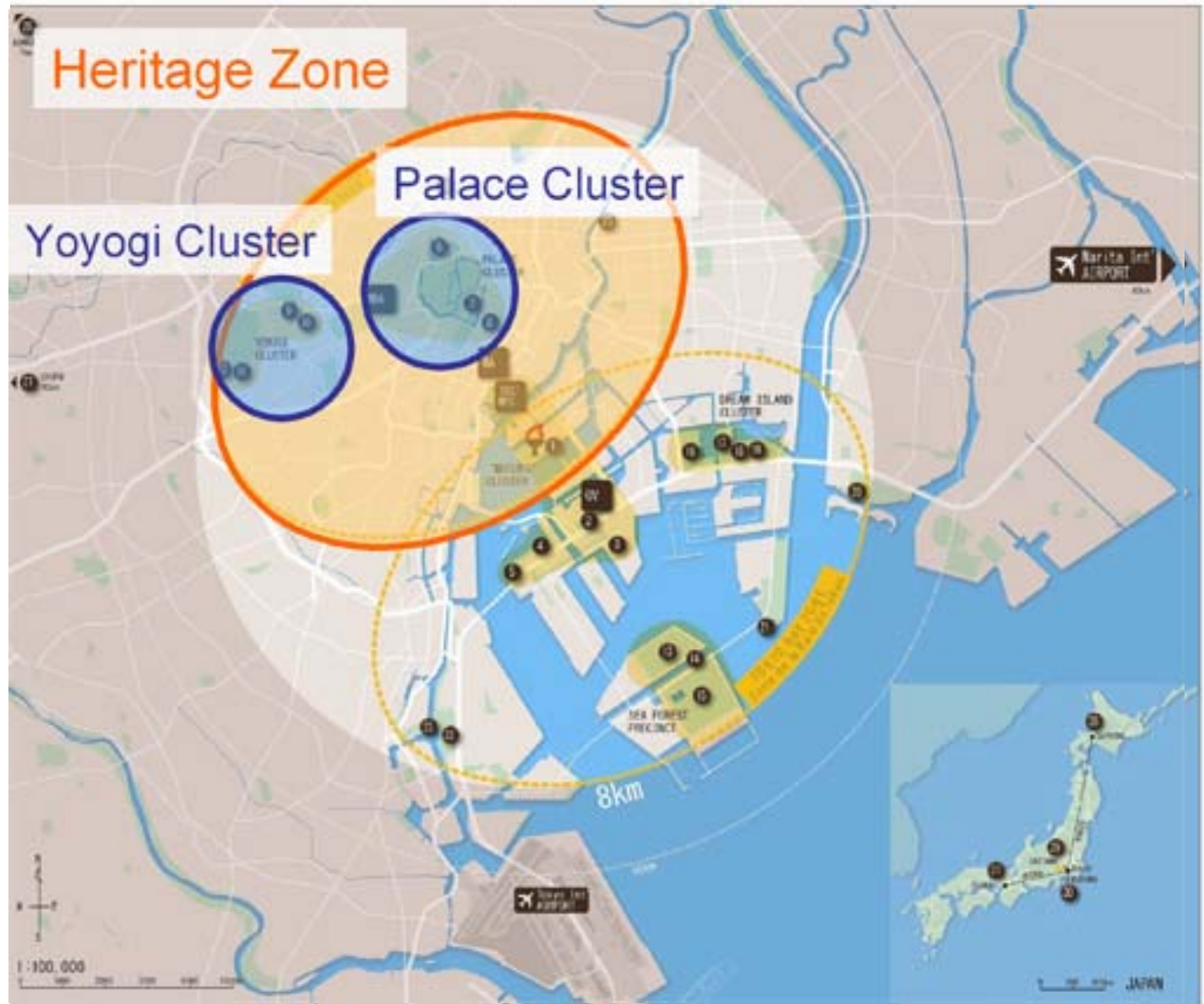

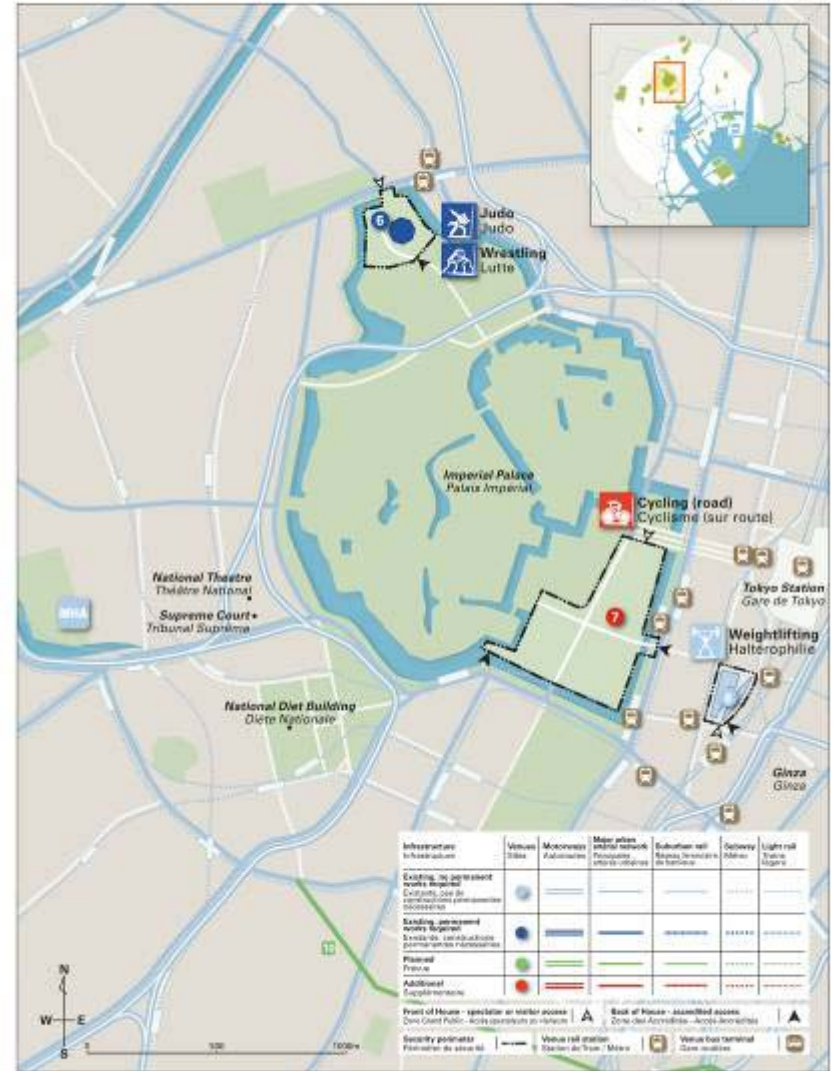

Plan B3 Noyau Yooyogi

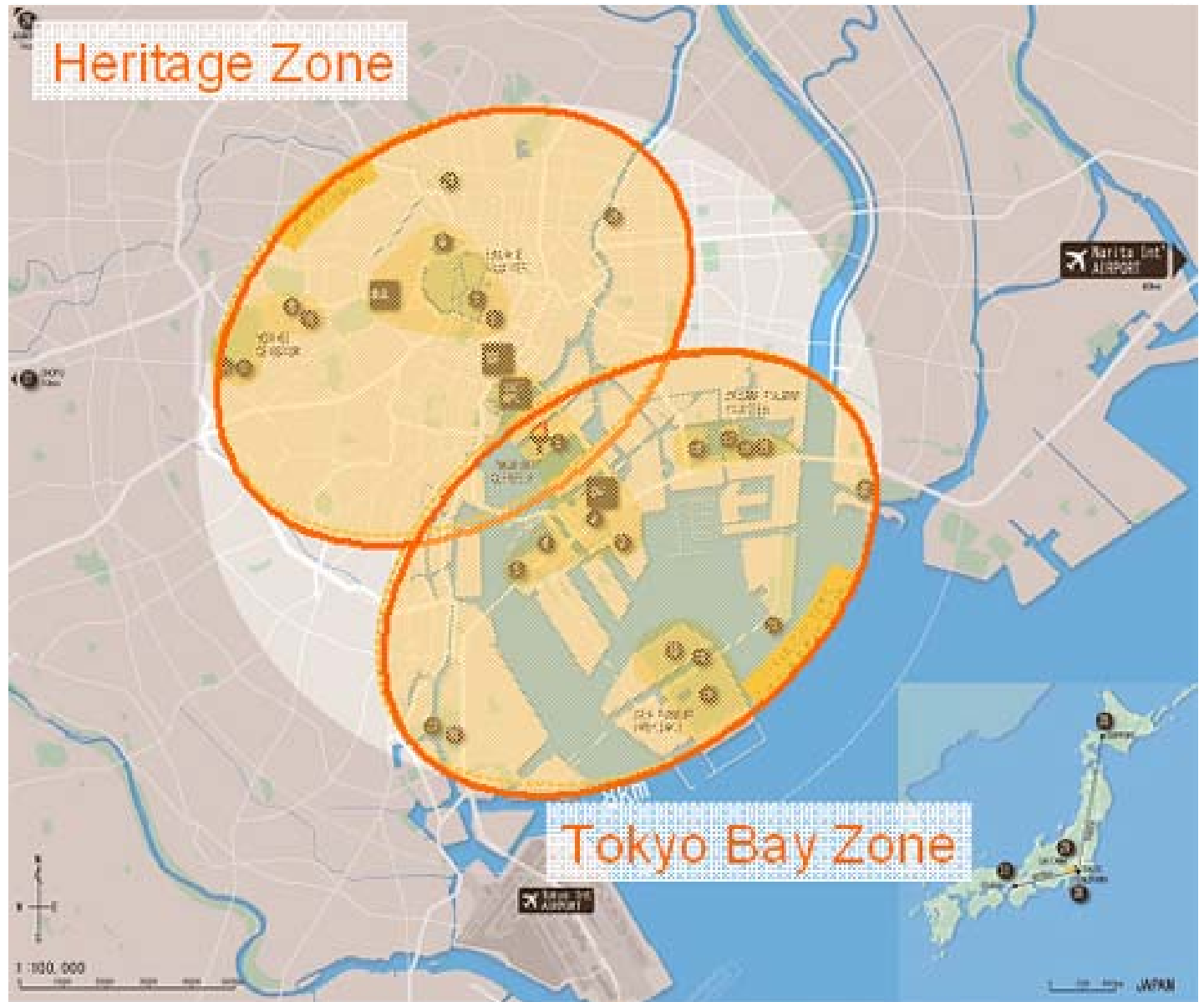

Noyau du Palais Plan B2

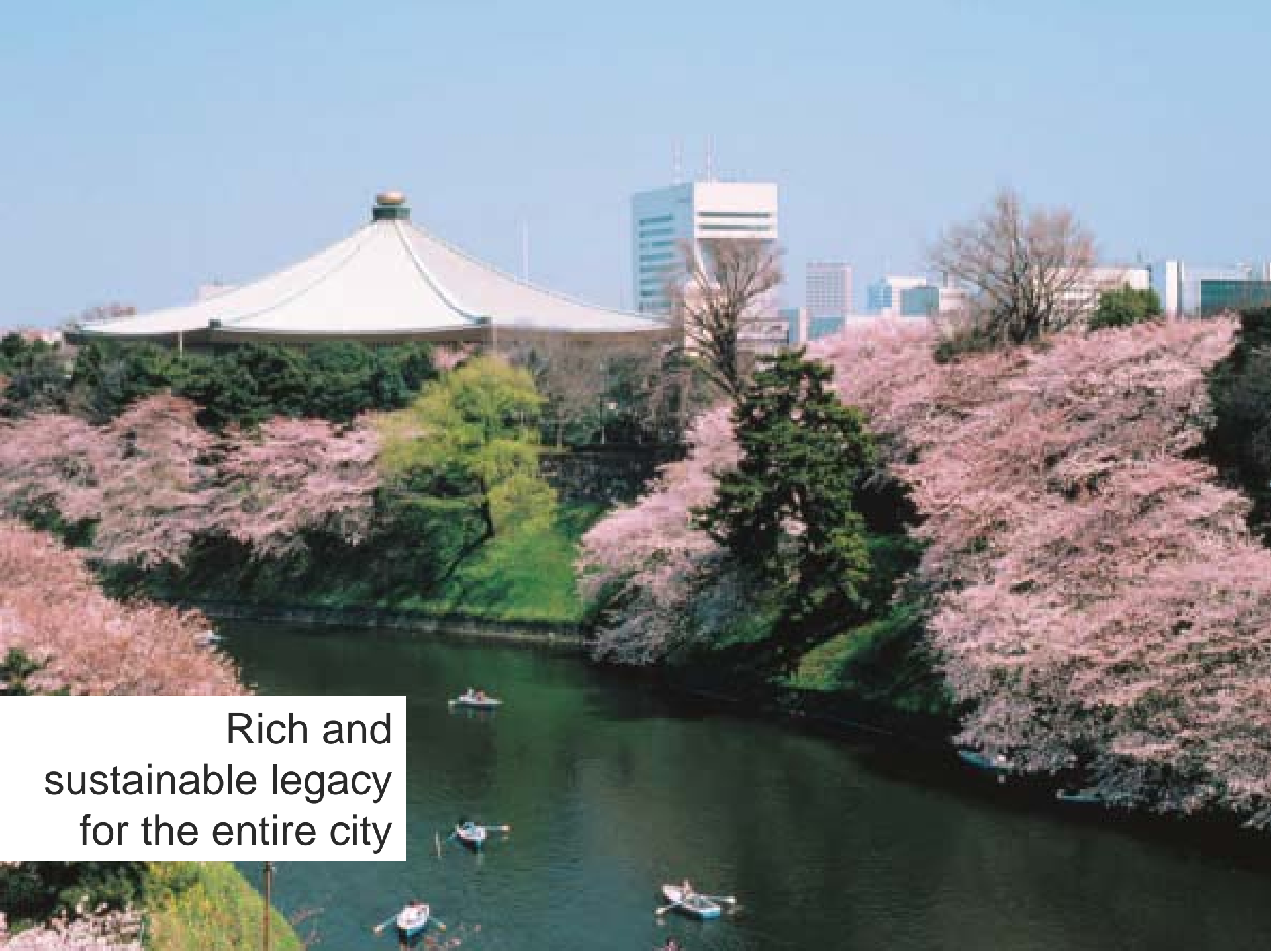
